
THE TWO HOLY MOSQUES




A Large assembly of believers prostrating themselves to Allah, the Exalted in a unique array, which clearly demonstrates their humbleness and submissiveness to Allah




Hundreds of thousands of Muslims gather to perform the five daily prayers




A picture of the Sacred Kaabah, in which crowds of Muslims are performing prayer in perfect circles towards it



A picture depicting the large number of Muslims performing prayer around the Kaabah in perfect lines. No distinction is made between black and white, rich and poor, or elder and young



A stunning picture of the Haram (The Holy Mosque) taken at night during the Taraweeh Prayer in the month of Ramadhan










The door of the Kaabah

The Prophet's Mosque and its outside area





The open area surrounding the Prophet's Mosque














Many Muslims visit the Prophet's Mosque (May peace and blessings be upon him) from which Islam spread far and wide
